

Killed Trades Careers Are For You!


Dear Grown Ups,

When I grow up, I want to be an electrician.




Electricians make sure the lights can be turned on in your house, so you can always play even when it's dark outside.

When I grow up, I want to be a barber




Barbers cut and style men's hair and make them look good. Girls go to hair dressers or cosmetologists to get their hair cut and colored and their nails painted.

When I grow up, I want to be a heavy equipment operator.




Heavy equipment operators use bulldozers and backhoes to move dirt to make room for buildings and roads.

A machinist takes a piece of steel and makes parts for a motor or an old car that you see at parades.


When I grow up, I want to be a medical assistant.

porch railings or doors.


When I grow up, I want to be a plumber.
